PLAYOFF RACES IN FULL SWING AS NFC CLUBS VIE FOR POSITION

As the NFL enters Week 13, there are 17 teams either in or within one game of a playoff spot, including eight in the NFC.

The New York Giants have the toughest remaining schedule among those NFC clubs, facing opponents with a combined 35-20 (.636) mark.
