WHAT TO LOOK FOR – A LOOK BACK

AARON IT OUT: Green Bay Packers quarterback **AARON RODGERS** completed 22 of 33 passes (66.7 percent) for 307 yards with two touchdowns versus zero interceptions for a 116.6 passer rating in the Packers' 27-15 Thanksgiving Day victory at the Detroit Lions.

With his 110+ passer rating last week, he recorded his 11th consecutive game this season with a passer rating of at least 110 and tied Pro Football Hall of Famer **STEVE YOUNG** (11 in 1994) for the most games with a 110+ passer rating in one season.

Since becoming the Packers' starting quarterback in 2008, Rodgers has completed 1,263 passes (second in NFL) for 15,869 yards (third in NFL) with 119 touchdowns (second in NFL) for a 104.7 passer rating (first in NFL). He reached 1,250 completions, 15,000 passing yards and 100 passing TDs in 58 career starts, tied for the fewest starts to reach all three marks among quarterbacks who began their careers in the Super Bowl era (since 1966).

LONG TRADITIONS: St. Louis Rams defensive end **CHRIS LONG**, son of Pro Football Hall of Famer **HOWIE LONG** (1981-1993), registered one sack in the Rams' 23-20 loss to the Arizona Cardinals to total a career-best 10 sacks this season. The pair joins **CLAY MATTHEWS, JR.** (1978-1996) and **CLAY MATTHEWS** (2009-2011) as the only father-son duos to each register double-digit sacks in at least one season since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR ON MNF: One more note to keep in mind for tonight's *Monday Night Football* game between the Giants and Saints...

MANNING UP: New York Giants quarterback **ELI MANNING** has passed for 2,952 yards with 18 touchdowns this season heading into a *Monday Night Football* showcase against the New Orleans Saints.

If Manning passes for at least 48 yards and two touchdowns against New Orleans, he will record his seventh-consecutive season with at least 3,000 passing yards and 20 passing TDs, making him one of only five quarterbacks to record such a streak in NFL history.
