JETS QB GENO SMITH, RAIDERS S CHARLES WOODSON &
BROWNS PR TRAVIS BENJAMIN NAMED AFC PLAYERS OF WEEK 5

Quarterback **GENO SMITH** of the New York Jets, safety **CHARLES WOODSON** of the Oakland Raiders and punt returner **TRAVIS BENJAMIN** of the Cleveland Browns are the AFC Offensive, Defensive and Special Teams Players of the Week for games played the fifth week of the 2013 season (October 3, 6-7), the NFL announced today.

# OFFENSE: QB GENO SMITH, NEW YORK JETS

- Smith completed 16 of 20 passes (80 percent) for 199 yards with three touchdowns versus zero interceptions and a 147.7 passer rating in the Jets' 30-28 win at Atlanta on *Monday Night Football*.
- Smith's 147.7 passer rating was a single-game best in the NFL in 2013.
- Smith completed 80 percent of his passes with three touchdowns against Atlanta for the second-highest completion percentage by any rookie in a three-TD game in NFL history.
- Became the second rookie quarterback ever to win on the road on Monday Night Football (ED RUBBERT with Redskins in 1987).
- In his rookie season from West Virginia, this is Smith's first AFC Offensive Player of the Week award. He is the
  first Jets quarterback to win the award since MARK SANCHEZ in 2010 (Week 11).
- He is the first Jets rookie to win Offensive Player of the Week honors.

# **DEFENSE: S CHARLES WOODSON, OAKLAND RAIDERS**

- Woodson registered four tackles, one interception, one pass defensed and returned a fumble 25 yards for a touchdown in the Raiders' 27-17 win over San Diego.
- Woodson now has 13 combined return touchdowns off of turnovers (11 interceptions and two fumble recoveries), tying DARREN SHARPER and Pro Football Hall of Famer ROD WOODSON for the most in NFL history.
- With :53 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, Woodson sealed the victory when he intercepted Chargers quarterback **PHILIP RIVERS** at the Raiders' 16. Woodson posted his 18th career interception as a Raider.
- Played a pivotal role for a Raiders defense that forced five takeaways (three interceptions, two fumble recoveries).
- In his 16th season from Michigan, this is Woodson's fifth career Defensive Player of the Week Award. He most recently won the award in 2010 (Week 4) with the Green Bay Packers. This is Woodson's first Defensive Player of the Week award with the Raiders.

### SPECIAL TEAMS: PR TRAVIS BENJAMIN, CLEVELAND BROWNS

- Benjamin returned seven punts for 179 yards (25.6 average), including a 79-yard touchdown in the Browns' 37-24 win over Buffalo.
- His 179 punt return yards were the most in a single-game in Browns history.
- Recorded a 57-yard punt-return in the first quarter, setting up a 30-yard field goal by Browns kicker BILLY CUNDIFF.
- His 25.6 PR average against Buffalo is the highest by any NFL player in a game this season (minimum five attempts). He is the only NFL player with two 50-yard punt returns in a contest this season.
- Through Week 5, Benjamin ranks second in the NFL with a 15.1-yard punt-return average.
- In his second season from the University of Miami, this is Benjamin's second Special Teams Player of the Week Award. He previously won the award in 2012 (Week 14).
- He joins punter SPENCER LANNING as the second Browns player to win Special Teams Player of the Week honors in 2013.

- Denver tight end JULIUS THOMAS, who had nine receptions for 122 yards (13.6 average) with two touchdowns.
- Baltimore wide receiver TORREY SMITH, who had six receptions for 121 yards (20.2 average) in the Ravens' 26-23 win at Miami.

- Cincinnati defensive end **WALLACE GILBERRY**, who had four tackles, two sacks and one forced fumble in the Bengals' 13-6 win over New England.

- Denver linebacker **DANNY TREVATHAN**, who had five tackles, one interception and one pass defensed.

- Cleveland safety **T.J. WARD**, who posted five tackles, one pass defensed and a 44-yard interception-return touchdown.
- New York Jets defensive end MUHAMMAD WILKERSON, who seven tackles, one sack and one forced fumble.
