SEVEN FROM SUNDAY – WEEK 13

A look at seven statistical highlights from games played at 1:00 p.m. ET and 4:00 p.m. ET on Sunday, December 1, the 13th week of the 2013 season.

- Denver quarterback **PEYTON MANNING** passed for 403 yards and five touchdowns in the Broncos' 35-28 win at Kansas City. Manning has won his first 10 division starts with the Broncos and joins **KURT WARNER** (11) as the **only players since the 1970 merger to win their first 10 division starts with a team.**

Manning leads the NFL with 4,125 passing yards, the most ever through the first 12 games of a season. He recorded his **13th career 4,000-yard season, extending his record for the most in NFL history.** **DREW BREES** ranks second with seven 4,000-yard seasons.

The game marked Manning's **eighth career game with at least five touchdown passes, tied with Brees for the most in NFL history.**

Manning's 41 touchdown passes are **tied for the second-most (TOM BRADY, 2007) through the first 12 games of a season.** Manning had 44 touchdown passes through the first 12 games of the 2004 season.

- Cleveland's **JOSH GORDON** had 10 catches for 261 yards with two touchdowns and Chicago's **ALSHON JEFFERY** recorded 12 catches for 249 yards with two touchdowns marking the **first time in NFL history two players had at least 10 catches for 200 yards and two touchdowns on the same day.**

Gordon and Jeffery each have two 200-yard receiving games in 2013 and are **among the eight different players in NFL history to have multiple 200-yard receiving games in a single season.**

Gordon, who had 14 catches for 237 yards and a touchdown last week, is the **first player in NFL history to have 200 receiving yards in consecutive games.**

- Minnesota running back **ADRIAN PETERSON** rushed for 211 yards in the Vikings' 23-20 overtime win over Chicago. Playing in his 101st career game, **Peterson became the third fastest player in NFL history to reach 10,000 rushing yards** (10,057), trailing Pro Football Hall of Famers **ERIC DICKERSON** (91 games) and **JIM BROWN** (98).

Peterson is one of only five players in NFL history to rush for at least 10,000 yards in his first seven seasons, joining Dickerson (11,226), **LA DAINIAN TOMLINSON** (10,650), **BARRY SANDERS** (10,172) and **EMMITT SMITH** (10,160).

- The Vikings-Bears contest is the **third game in NFL history to have a 200-yard rusher (Minnesota's ADRIAN PETERSON, 211 rushing yards) and a 200-yard receiver (Chicago's ALSHON JEFFERY, 249 receiving yards).**

The previous two instances occurred on September 16, 2007 (Cleveland's **JAMAL LEWIS**, 216 rushing and Cincinnati's **CHAD JOHNSON**, 209 receiving) and January 3, 2010 (Kansas City's **JAMAAL CHARLES**, 259 rushing and Denver's **JABAR GAFFNEY**, 213 receiving).

- Philadelphia quarterback **NICK FOLES** threw three touchdown passes and no interceptions in the Eagles' 24-21 win over Arizona. This season, Foles has **19 touchdown passes and no interceptions, the second longest streak to start a season for the most touchdown passes before throwing an interception** (**PEYTON MANNING**, 20 in 2013 for Denver).
- Carolina quarterback **CAM NEWTON** passed for two touchdowns and rushed for one in the Panthers' 27-6 win over Tampa Bay. In his third season, Newton has 10 games with at least two passing touchdowns and a rushing touchdown. That total is the **most such games by a player in his first three seasons in NFL history**.
- Houston wide receiver **ANDRE JOHNSON** had eight catches for 121 yards in the Texans' 34-31 loss to New England. Playing in his 150th career game, Johnson **recorded his 900th catch (900) and reached the milestone in the second-fewest games in NFL history**. **MARVIN HARRISON**, who finished his career with 1,102 receptions, accomplished the feat in 149 games.
