The Pro Football Hall of Fame has records for 215 father & son combinations who have played in the NFL. We have included later in this newsletter a chart of the sons of NFL Legends who either were drafted in Chicago last month or have signed with NFL clubs as rookie free agents.

Finally, if you are not one of the 3,000 players who already have registered, we strongly encourage you to join the NFL Legends Community where you can get reacquainted with your former teammates and clubs as well as meet NFL sponsors and licensees who may be able to assist you in your own businesses.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

KEITH MOODY: EDUCATOR, SUPER BOWL CHAMP, NFL LEGEND

Keith Moody, the current Director of Adult Education for the



Mountain View School District in the San Francisco Bay Area, has been involved in formal education for more than a quarter-century.

However, his football education includes playing at Syracuse in the early '70s and then five years in our league with the Bills (1976-79) and the Super Bowl XV Champion Raiders in 1980.

After his NFL career, Keith first coached in college but also spent time working with at-risk kids in Upstate New York where he was raised. He moved his family back to the West Coast, earned a Master's Degree and became a high school counsellor. A short time later, he transitioned into a productive and satisfying education-administration career.

"I obviously enjoyed the intensity of hitting and playing," Keith recalls, "and I do still kind of miss that because in administration you have to be more diplomatic. However, academics have been my life now for years and that's where I pride myself. Helping the adults do well in my current position or, in earlier years as school principal, hiring the right teachers and getting our high school kids into good colleges, that's been my game plan. One other big benefit to my adult ed post is it gives me time to sneak away and see my son Keith, Jr. who is our high school record holder for 800 meters. I wouldn't trade where I am today."

The NFL wouldn't trade Keith Moody either...nor the countless other retired players who have devoted your post football careers to teaching, coaching or non-profit foundation work. We are proud of all of you!

NFL LEGENDS IN THE NEWS



Two popular Legends will be inducted into the Tampa Bay Buccaneers Ring of Honor during the team's 40th anniversary season this fall. Former QB **Doug Williams** (pictured left) and RB **Mike Alstott** (pictured right) will have their numbers placed on the Raymond James Stadium wall during games this season. "Doug and Mike were winners on the field and left a lasting mark on our community long after their playing days," says Bucs Co-Chairman **Bryan Glazer**. Williams is now a front office executive for his "other" team – the Washington Redskins – while Alstott is the head football coach at Northside Christian School in St. Petersburg, and also is founder of the Mike Alstott Family Foundation in the Tampa area.

No booing for your fellow NFL Legends but... DB **Steve Freeman** (Bills, 1975-86; Vikings, 1987) and T **Phil McKinnely** (Falcons, 1976-80; Rams, 1981; Bears, 1982) are returning to the field this season as part of the 122-member officiating crew. Freeman returns for his 15th year as a back judge while McKinnely will be a head linesman for his 13th season. If you want to feel old, Steve's son, Brad, will be officiating in his 2nd season as an NFL field judge... If you are looking for former players **Jabari Greer** and **Ben Hartsock** this fall, you may have to travel to the UK to locate them. Both Greer (CB Bills, 2004-08; Saints 2009-13) and Hartsock (TE Colts, 2004-05; Titans; 2006-07, Falcons, 2008; Jets, 2009-10; Panthers, 2011-13) have signed on to broadcast out of London this season. Both players are graduates

of NFL Player Engagement's Broadcasting Boot camp last month.

The Jack Brewer Foundation and the United States Federation for Middle East Peace last month partnered for a trip to Port-au-Prince, Haiti in an effort to raise support for philanthropic efforts in the area. S **Jack Brewer** (Vikings, 2002-03; Giants, 2004; Eagles, 2005) heads an organization that works to empower families living in impoverished communities. NFL Legends RB **Clinton Portis**, LB **Takeo Spikes** and WR **Lee Evans** also made the humanitarian trip.

NFL Legend LB **Willie McGinest**, a three-time Super Bowl Champion, has been selected as the 24th member of the Patriots Hall of Fame. He will join DT **Houston Antwine** (1961-71), who was named posthumously by the senior selection committee, as the two-member Class of 2015 that will be enshrined this summer in a ceremony outside the Hall at Patriot Place in Foxboro. McGinest, who played 12 of his 15 NFL seasons in New England, currently is a broadcaster on NFL Network. Antwine was a member of both the team's 50th Anniversary Team and 1960s All Decade Team.

AFL All-Star C **Al Bemiller** was introduced this month as the newest member of the Greater Buffalo Sports Hall of Fame. Al played from 1961-69 with the Bills and never missed a game... Speaking of the AFL, 83-year old QB **Cotton Davidson** is living proof you are never too old to be honored. Cotton, who was the first Baylor Bears QB to be a first round NFL draft pick (by the Colts in 1954), was inducted this spring into the Southwest Conference Hall of Fame. Davidson had his career interrupted by military service but returned to play in the early 1960s AFL with the Dallas Texans (aka Kansas City Chiefs) and Raiders. Three-time Pro Bowler **Eric Metcalf**, son of former Cardinals and Redskins RB **Terry Metcalf**, also was inducted with Davidson into the Hall.
