WHAT TO LOOK FOR – A LOOK BACK

FRESH START: Six teams are undefeated through their first three games of the season – Arizona, Atlanta, Carolina, Cincinnati, Denver and New England. **GREEN BAY** can reach 3-0 on Monday night with a win over Kansas City.

While no guarantee of future success, a strong start to the season is a good omen – 75 percent of teams (93 of 124) that started 3-0 since 1990 made the playoffs.

COMPLETE SUCCESS: On *Sunday Night Football*, Denver quarterback **PEYTON MANNING** completed 31 of 42 passes for 324 yards and two touchdowns in the Broncos' 24-12 win over Detroit. Manning, who has 6,008 career completions, joined **BRETT FAVRE** (6,300) as the only players to reach 6,000 career completions.

TOM TERRIFIC: New England quarterback **TOM BRADY** completed 33 of 42 passes (78.6) for 358 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions for a 118.1 passer rating in the Patriots' 51-17 win over Jacksonville. Brady, who has nine touchdowns without an interception this season, joined **PEYTON MANNING** (2010, 2013) and **DON MEREDITH** (1966) as the only players in NFL history to pass for at least nine touchdowns with no interceptions in the first three games of a season.

CATCHING ON: Atlanta wide receiver **JULIO JONES** had 12 catches for 164 yards with two touchdowns in the Falcons' 39-28 win over Dallas. Jones, who has 34 receptions this season, surpassed **TROY BROWN** (31 in 2002), **CLARK GAINES** (31 in 1980) and **WES WELKER** (31 in 2011) for the most catches through a team's first three games of a season.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR ON MNF: One more note to keep in mind for tonight's *Monday Night Football* game between the Chiefs and Packers...

COMPLETE SUCCESS: In 2015, quarterbacks have completed 2,142 of 3,317 passes for a 64.6 completion percentage, the highest league-wide completion percentage through Week 3 in NFL history. If the current percentage stays at this pace, it would rank as the highest of any season.

SUPER BOWL REMATCHES FEATURED THIS SEASON

CHIEFS VS PACKERS

The 2015 NFL regular-season schedule features 19 Super Bowl rematches as part of the year-long celebration of Super Bowl 50, which will be played on Sunday, February 7, 2016 at Levi's Stadium in Santa Clara, California.

On *Monday Night Football*, the Packers will host the Chiefs in a rematch of Super Bowl I, which the Packers won 35-10. Rematches are part of the NFL's *On The Fifty* platform, designed to link the past 49 Super Bowls with this year's game and honor the teams, players, coaches, fans and communities that have been a part of those games.
